He attended country school, worked on the family farm and at the age of 19, he joined the army serving as a decoder at the 8th Army Headquarters in Japan after World War II. Following his discharge in June of 1947, Vernon returned to Nebraska where he met and married Nora Ellen Blumanhourst on November 9, 1949 at the Methodist Church in Lexington. The couple lived in Sumner until they moved to Kearney in 2008.

His occupations were farming, Dyer's Tavern owner, Agricultural Soil Conservation Service, and then Dawson County weed superintendent for 20 years.

He was active in the American Legion and the Sumner Community Club. Vernon was a charter member of the Sumner Rescue Unit, Secretary-Treasurer of the Nebraska Weed Control, and member of the Hastings Community College Agricultural Board.
