Agnes was preceded in death by her son, Adam Einspahr; husband, Harold Einspahr; 4 brothers; 1 sister; and her parents.

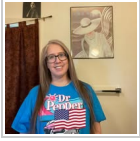

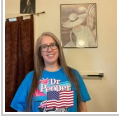
