He entered into the U.S. Army on July 18, 1945 and served during the WWII. He was honorably discharged on December 10, 1945. Bud was united in marriage to Enid "Betty" Overturf on January 7, 1939 in Hastings, Nebraska. He was employed by the Munitions Depot and worked for the U.S. Post Office for over 40 years. Bud was a published author, a great wit, and an avid fisherman. After retirement, Bud became a "Fonner Favorite" and enjoyed the horse races.
