August 6, 1928 - June 7, 2010

Carl O. Broweleit, 81, of Kearney, died Monday, June 7, 2010 at the Nebraska Veterans Home in Grand Island. Funeral services will be 10:30 AM, Thursday at O'Brien Straatmann Funeral Home in Kearney. The Revs. Bob Wine and Roger Wendt will officiate. Interment with military rites will be at the Kearney Cemetery conducted by the NE National Guard Honors Team in conjunction with the VFW Post 759 and the American Legion Post 52 of Kearney. Visitation will be 6-8 PM, Wednesday at the funeral home. Memorials are suggested to the Parkinson's Research Association. O'Brien Straatmann Funeral Home in Kearney is in charge of arrangements. Carl was born August 6, 1928 in Kearney to Otto and Gerda (Grigull) Broweleit. He lived his life on a farm northwest of Kearney. He attended Glenwood School, where he graduated from 8th grade with honors, which was remarkable since he only spoke German when he started school at the age of 6. He taught his mother to read English as he learned at school. He graduated from Kearney High School in 1946. He served his country in the Army during the Korean War. After the war he returned to farm with his dad. He was married to Delores McCarty in Kearney on Feb. 5, 1956. They had three sons, Robert, James and Roger. His love was machinery and farming. He was a charter member of the Assembly of God Church in Kearney. He served on the Glenwood School board. He enjoyed seeing his boys participate in 4-H projects. His hobby was having coffee with his buddies. Because of his Parkinson's disease, he had to have further care. He came into the home of Frank and Barbara Rodriguez in

Shelton in July 2006. He received excellent home care and became part of their family. He moved to the NE Veterans Home in March of 2010. Survivors include his wife of Kearney, Robert and wife, Connie of Seneca, James of Burwell and Roger of Kearney, 7 grandchildren and close family friend, Mike Hutchinson and wife, Wanda of Doniphan. His parents and one grandson, Justyn, preceded him in death.
