Dale D. Hall, 82, of Kearney died Wednesday, May 26, 2010 at St. John's Good Samaritan Center in Kearney. Funeral services will be 9:30 AM, Saturday May 29th at the 56th Street Baptist Church in Kearney. The Rev. Marvin Valdois will officiate. Interment will be in the Kearney Cemetery. Military rites at graveside will be conducted by the NE National Guard Honors Team in conjunction with the American Legion Post 52 and VFW Post 759 of Kearney. Visitation will be 5-7pm, Friday at O'Brien Straatmann Funeral Home in Kearney. Memorials are suggested to the church. O'Brien Straatmann Funeral Home in Kearney is in charge of arrangements. He was born January 24, 1928 in Custer County, NE to Clarence and Stella (Sailor) Hall. He grew up in Custer County and Buffalo County, attending school in Berwyn and graduating from Riverdale school. On March 30, 1946, he entered the U.S. Army and served during WWII. He was honorably discharged September 3, 1947. On August 31, 1952, he married Evelyn Rose Meyer in Elwood. They lived and farmed near Elm Creek, Overton, Riverdale and Kearney, NE and Lebanon, MO. He drove a Standard Oil tank truck in the rural Kearney area. He owned and operated a tourist cavern and campground in southeast Missouri. He also spent two years in Michigan. He was a member of the regular Baptist Church in Kearney, the Communion Chapel in Lebanon, MO, and Kearney Baptist Temple, now 56th Street Baptist Church. He was a deacon in both the regular Baptist Church and the Communion Chapel. He volunteered for one year as manager of Bennett Springs Christian

Campground in Missouri. He was a former member of VFW Post 759 in Kearney. His hobbies included hunting and fishing. He loved animals and working outdoors. Survivors include his wife, Evelyn of Kearney; daughters, Lynda Hoerath and husband Jim of Powell, OH and Kathryn Janes and husband Bill of Livonia, MI; grandchildren, Shannon Yee, Natalie Walls, Amber Allen, Seven Hoerath and Trillion Hoerath; 5 great grandchildren; and nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents and three sisters.
