Dorothy Miller, 79 of Gibbon passed away Thursday, November 12, 2020 at Methodist Hospital in Omaha, NE. Funeral services will be 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, November 18, 2020 at Faith United Church in Gibbon. Interment will follow at Riverside Cemetery in Gibbon. 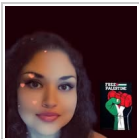
