Emerentiana "Sr Amy" Pouliot, 93 of Kearney died Tuesday, November 15, 2011 at Mt. Carmel Home in Kearney. Mass of Christian Burial will be 9:30 AM, Saturday at the Mt. Carmel Home Chapel in Kearney. The Revs. Tom Mullowney and James O'Connor will officiate. Interment will be in the Kearney Cemetery. Visitation will be 5-7 pm Friday with a rosary at 7:00 pm at Mt. Carmel Chapel. Sr. Amy was born on August 6, 1918 in Kingscroft, Quebec, Canada. Her mother gave her the name of Emerentiana, which was the name of the mother of St. Ann. They were a large, happy family of four boys and four girls when they moved from Canada to Vermont. In time they became naturalized citizens of the United States. She had only finished grammar school when she was accepted into The Corpus Christi Carmelite Congregation in Middletown, New York on June 15, 1949. Sister made her Final profession on September 9, 1954. In 1968 she received a certificate from the New York Institute of Dietetics. She was transferred to Mt. Carmel Home in Kearney in October 1973 after being in Middletown for 21 years. At that time she was the supervisor of the kitchen. In 1986 became became a certified Diet Manager. In 1988, Sr. Emerentiana was appointed superior of the Carmelite Community in Kearney but kept working in the kitchen at the Home until 1992. She was a quiet person with a good sense of humor. She had a natural talent for all types

of artwork. She was a gifted artist and through the years have done many beautiful paintings, woodcarvings and all sorts of craftwork, as well as sewing. She is survived by several nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents, brothers and sisters.
