was stationed in Japan during the Korean War. He proudly served his country until his honorable discharge in 1954.

On June 11, 1955 Glen was united in marriage to Helen Dobish and to this union four children were born: Glenda, Vaughn, Sharlyn and Deloris. He was a lifetime resident of Buffalo County and was the recipient of an AKSARBEN Century Farm Award. Glen spent most of his life farming and raising livestock, his true passion was cattle.

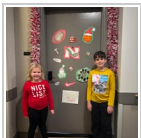
