She grew up in the Kearney area, graduating from Elm Creek High School in 1957. She received her BA of Nursing degree from UNMC in 1961. From 1962-64 she worked in Las Vegas for the Clark County Schools. She later moved back to Kearney in 1964. She married James Simon in Kearney on August 14, 1964. He died in 1966. She married Wayne (Ed) Reynolds on Feb. 25, 1970 in Colorado Springs, CO. He died in 1996. She worked at Good Samaritan Hospital for over 25 years before her retirement in 1989. After her retirement, she volunteered at the Buffalo County Immunization Clinic and worked as a Buffalo County poll worker. She was a member of Prince of Peace Catholic Church in Kearney, American Nurse's Association, and the Nebraska Nurse's Association. She enjoyed playing cards, reading, gardening, crossword puzzles, football games, and trips to the Colgan Cabin. Survivors include her brother, Joe Colgan and wife, Mary of Durango, CO, brother-in-law, Clyde James and wife, Jan of Kearney, and sister-in-law Kay
