Loyd D. Howsden, 82, died on Monday, August 15, 2011, at the Good Samaritan Hospital in Kearney. Funeral Service will be 10:30 A.M., Wednesday, August 17, 2011, at the First Christian Church in Kearney with Reverend Lewis Champ officiating. Interment will be at 1:30 P.M., at the Bainbridge Cemetery, outside of Huntley. Family will receive friends one hour prior to the service at the church. Loyd was born on November 23, 1928 in a farm home outside of Huntley, Nebraska to Roy and Pearl (Blickenstaff) Howsden. He grew up in Huntley and received his education at Huntley Public School and then Kearney State College, where he received a Specialists Degree in School Administration. He entered the Army in January of 1951 and served during the Korean War. He was honorably discharged in June of 1953. He was united in marriage to Peggy (Scott) on January 11, 1958 in Benkelman, NE. After which the couple lived in Huntley where he was employed by Huntley Public School. He was employed as a school administrator for several school systems in south-central Nebraska, and worked as a farmer his whole life. Loyd was a member of the Lions Club, Cosmos and the First Christian Church of Kearney. He loved raising and riding quarter horses. He is survived by his wife Peggy Howsden of Kearney; sons, Bill and wife Susan Howsden of Lincoln, Barry Howsden of Santa Barbara, CA, Blake and wife Shelly Howsden of Oshkosh,

NE, and Bret Howsden of Harrison, NE; daughters Shelley and husband Duane Burney of McPherson, KS, and Samantha and husband Calvin Hubbard of Grand Island; sister Lola May McNickle of North Platte; 13 Grand-Children and 3 Great-Grandchildren.
