“ David, Shawn & family, I do not know that you would remember me, but I am Jack & Millie Wilkinson's daughter. I saw in today's Jmst Sun that your dear wife & mother had passed away. She looked like the same Margaret that I remember from 35+ years ago, except with a few years of maturity on her [like the rest of us]. A memory that I'd like to share with you, is one from probably 40 years ago. She must have overheard my brother, Jim saying something about my mother's voice/singing. Margaret told him "God said to make a 'joyful noise to the Lord', he didn't say it had to be in tune!" I have never forgotten that incident. I remind my own children that. They happen to have inherited their father's beautiful voice & my dad's musical ability [he used to play violin by ear]. My mother sang, from her heart, even tho she didn't have the best musical ability. I do not know the circumstances of Margarets passing at such a young age, but I pray that your family will receive great comfort from God as he enfolds you in His arms. Something that someone told us when we lost Jim in '81 [in a tractor rollover accident at the age of 22] "You never get over missing them.... You just get used to them being away."
