She was the

church pianist at the Glenvil First Baptist Church for many years and taught Sunday School. She also played piano on Wednesday night church service at First Baptist Church in Kearney. Margaret was a Christian woman who accepted Jesus as her personal Lord and Savior. She was baptized in Believer's baptism as a young girl. She was an encourager to church family by sending cards and keeping them in her prayers. Family and faith were her two greatest joys. Her hobbies included quilting, sewing, knitting and crocheting.
