Mary Lynn formed especially close bonds with her older sister and brother. Mary Lynn moved to Oregon in 1991 to be closer to her birth family.

Mary Lynn had a passion for helping others and always had a special place in her heart for children in need. She transcended much of the adversity of her own childhood by helping countless children find their way. She was the founder of the WISE-Choice program for at-risk teenagers in Oregon. WISE-Choice was her pride and joy, and she helped teenage girls build their self-esteem and confidence amid extremely challenging circumstances in their lives.

Mary Lynn found her soulmate, William “Bill” Fowler, and married him on her 50th birthday in 1999. Mary Lynn and Bill were inseparable and were perfect compliments to each other. She was known as “Grammy” to her grandchildren, and she took great pleasure in being a grandmother. She returned to Nebraska in 2004 to reside closer to her young grandchildren. Mary Lynn had a special love for her pets, especially her German Shepards, King and Raider. Mary Lynn loved collecting turtle figurines, gardening, watching Husker football with a red beer, having coffee with friends, thumbing through catalogs, watching Hallmark movies, playing the slots, and brightening a person’s day. Her smile radiated kindness and love, and she shared it generously with everyone. She was blessed to have many loving friends and family whom she cherished spending time with.

She was preceded in death by her father, Arthur Bucy; mother, Mary Jane “Peggy” Jenkins; brother, Michael Flick; and sister, Star La Carlson.
