Myron D. Letcher, 68 of Kearney died Friday, September 16, 2016 at Kearney Regional Medical Center. Funeral services will be at 10:30 AM, Thursday at the First Baptist Church in Kearney. The Rev. Stan Murdoch will officiate. Burial with military rites will be at 2:30 PM at Ft. McPherson National Cemetery near Maxwell, NE.

Myron Letcher was born on January 20, 1948 at Methodist Hospital in Mitchell, SD. He attended grade school at Jefferson #6 and graduated from Emery High School in 1966. Myron joined the Army in September 1966, and attended basic training at Fort Bliss, TX, moving on to advanced training at Fort Huachuca, AZ. He was deployed to Vietnam for 12 months before being reassigned to Germany. He returned to Vietnam and remained there for the rest of his service until Sept 1969.

Myron moved his family from South Dakota to Nebraska in 1980. He was employed at John Deere Implement and later at Fairbanks International Implement in Kearney. His specialty was combines and also managed the department for a number of years.

Myron married Carol Beadle, January 1, 1998, and they lived in or around the Kearney area.

Myron is survived by his loving wife Carol; son Daniel Letcher and wife Erica, children Ava and Mason of Denver, CO; daughter Lori Fisher and husband Tim, children Jonathan and Andrew of Harleysville, PA; daughter Jody Parks and husband Jason, children Blake and Alivia of O'Neill, NE; stepdaughter Georgia Eatherton and husband Jeremy, children Madison and Taylor of Laveen, AZ; stepdaughter Ashley Blausey, children Skyelar and Journey of Kearney, NE.
