



## William O. Meyer

September 4, 1925 - September 23, 2017

William “Bill” Odie Meyer, age 92, passed away at his home in Kearney, Nebraska on September 23rd, 2017.

Bill was born on September 4th, 1925 in Ft. Crook, Nebraska to Martha and Wilhelm H. Meyer. Although he spent twenty years abroad while serving in the Navy, Nebraska was his home, and he loved the people in it. Some of his fondest childhood memories were made on the family ranch near Burwell where he spent endless hours hunting, reading and riding his horse.

Bill was a product of a generation that had lived through The Great Depression and World War II. He was hard-working, loyal, honest, brave and patriotic. At seventeen, he enlisted in the Navy so that he might join the battle to fight for his country. After twenty outstanding years serving under three admirals, he attained the rank of E8 as a Senior Chief Petty Officer and subsequently retired in 1963. Feeling the need to raise his family in his beloved home state, he moved back to Nebraska where he started and grew two successful businesses, Meyer Electric and Village Cleaners.

Anyone who knew Bill also knew that the title he cherished most was

“Dad.” He loved his family with all his heart and was so proud of each and every one of them. One of his greatest talents was his ability to find the best qualities in people and help them find a way to achieve their full potential. He not only did this for his family, but anyone that needed encouragement or a helping hand. He was our hero, our inspiration, our champion.

Bill was a Mason for over sixty years and a Shriner for over fifty years as well. He was a member of the American Legion, VFW and Lyons Club where he served as president from 1986-1987.

He married the love of his life, Marilyn Jean Meyer, on May 2nd, 1954, and they spent nearly fifty years raising a family of nine children. He lost Marilyn to Alzheimers in 2004, but never stopped loving her. Even when her memory slipped away and she could not recall his name, Bill would drive to see her 2-3 times a day. He was a devoted husband, father and friend. We will miss him dearly.

Bill is survived by his children and their spouses, William V. Meyer, John T. Meyer and his wife Sally, Raymond C. Meyer, Pamela Meyer Rasmussen and her husband Greg, Robert “Bob” Meyer and his wife, Karyn, Michael J. Meyer and his wife Roxanne, Deborah Meyer Carland and her husband Jim, Kimberly Meyer Hanzlik and her husband Duane, Gregory “Scott” Meyer and his wife Michelle. He also leaves behind his sister Ann Meyer Larsen, 26 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife Marilyn, his sisters Maria Meyer, Irene Meyer Norris, and Mary Meyer Burson.
